Summary

On the occasion of the 21st anniversary of the adoption of UNSCR 1325 (2000) on Women, Peace and Security, Women In International Security (WIIS) Italy is organizing a panel discussion to reflect on the current global security challenges, with a particular focus on the Afghan crisis and the devastating situation of Afghan women and girls. The event is promoted in collaboration with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of Italy and the Global Alliance of Regional Women Mediator Networks (GA).

Leading women mediators, peacebuilders and policymakers will discuss the urgency of this situation, address critical questions, and provide recommendations for a more cooperative, effective and inclusive response to the developing situation in Afghanistan.

Overview

Over the past six years, a number of regional women mediator networks have been launched in different regions across the globe, to support a full and meaningful participation of women in peace and mediation processes. In line with the main pillars embedded in UNSCR 1325 and related resolutions, women's participation in decision-making processes is instrumental to effective peacekeeping and to achieving a sustainable peace. The establishment of regional women mediator networks is part of initiatives that Member States have taken to translate their commitment to Women Peace and Security (WPS) into concrete actions. The launch of a Global Alliance of Regional Women Mediator Networks (GA) in 2019 offered a historic opportunity to create an inclusive space to connect and facilitate experience sharing between regional networks and to amplify women's common aspiration and commitment to lead or at least participate in peace processes.

Based on this assumption, this event aims at providing a platform to discuss the possible role and contribution of women mediator networks in face of current global security challenges, and specifically on the Afghan context, and analyses the key contribution that women mediator and peacebuilders can provide at a global level in supporting Afghan women in achieving sustainable peace in their country.

Objectives

The overall objective of the event is to keep the international community focused on the devasting situation that Afghan women and girls are currently facing. By developing specific recommendations beyond the rhetoric that often surrounds the narrative on Afghan women, GA members will discuss the implementation of the WPS agenda in Afghanistan in the new political context, with a view to promoting actions to protect women and girls, as well as to strengthening their equal and meaningful participation in peace and political processes.

Specific objectives:

- Provide a strategic space for women mediators and peacebuilders to inform and influence the peacekeeping strategies for Afghan women and girls;
- Exchange experiences and best practices on peacebuilding and peacekeeping;
- Increase the visibility and role of Regional Women Mediator Networks;
- Build stronger partnerships between policy makers and practitioners;
- Identify specific WPS priorities and areas for the networks' members to engage on the ground.

The event will be hosted on Zoom. It will be conducted in English with interpretation in French.
